In this part, we have put together several family lines, some of which were discovered after writing Part I, and some in which the connection to an ancestor is questionable. The records which are given in Part VI were used in putting these lines together. If the reader has not found his or her Underwood family line in Part I, or here, then the records of Part VI can be used to determine, in many cases, which Underwood line contains his or her ancestors. The marriage records are particularly useful in this regard. We became somewhat lazy in copying these records after a few days of work, so we stopped in Patrick County at about the year 1910; and in Floyd County and Franklin County, we stopped at about 1963, except for a few male Underwoods in Franklin County down to about 1984.

We have started the numbering system of this part at an arbitrary 501, since this part was written before completing Part III, and we did not know at what number we would end that part.

501 John Henry Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born in 1822 in Franklin County, Virginia, (son of Samuel 008, William 015 or Creed Underwood ?); married Iowa (Jane Prater ?) in 1838 and had five children:

- a. Henry, b. 1839.
- b. Pleasant G. (See 502).
- c. Mary, b. 1843.
- d. Sarah, b. 1845; married in 1869, Samuel Yopp.
- e. Asa, b. 1846. He is listed in the 1870 census as being twenty-three years of age and a laborer at Prater's house.

John Underwood is listed as Henry Underwood in the 1850 census of Franklin County. In the 1860 census, a Jane Underwood, presumably his wife, is shown with Samuel 008; and Pleasant Underwood, Henry's son, is shown as single, working at James Atkins' house (he later married a daughter of James Atkins). It is probable that his full name is John Henry Underwood, and that he is the same John Underwood listed in the 1840 census with one son under five, and wife forty to fifty years of age. A John Underwood is shown in the marriage records of Franklin

County marrying a Jane Prater in 1838. Creed Underwood, who we believe was Henry's brother, put up the required bond. Also, a John Underwood, son of Samuel and Docia Underwood, is listed in the death records index of Franklin County as being forty-three years of age at the time of his death in 1861. The marriage records of Franklin County show a John and Iowa Underwood as the parents of Pleasant Underwood (502 below). A more thorough study of the records could possibly clear up some of this.

502 Pleasant G. Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born in January, 1842 in Franklin County, Virginia (son of John Henry (?) 501); married on April 10, 1865, Margaret A. Atkins, daughter of James and Mary Atkins, and had at least six children:

a. Alton Monroe (Peter), born June 6, 1866.

b. Mary Ann, born September 15, 1867; married on August 2, 1883, Tazewell S. Greer, son of James and Elisabeth Greer.

c. Henry T., born March 8, 1872; married on January 5, 1890, Sarah E. Atkins, daughter of Jennie and Matten Atkins.

d. Green F., born circa 1875; married on May 1, 1902,

May Tinsler, daughter of Jesse and Addie Tinsler.

e. Charles W. (see 503).

f. James F., born 1880; married Laula E. Truster, dau. of Jesse W. and Adeline Truster.

The birth records also show a child named Alton M. born to Pleasant Underwood on June 9, 1866. We have assumed that this is the same as Monroe, and have so indicated above.

We assume that Pleasant G. Underwood was called Pied since he was often listed in various records as Plead or Pied Underwood.

503 Charles W. Underwood of Floyd County, Virginia, born on June 7, 1876, in Franklin County, Virginia, (son of Pleasant G. Underwood 502); married on May 16, 1899, Mary J. Atkins, daughter of Robert and Sarah Atkins, and had at least four children:

a. Lizzie (Elisabeth ?) Underwood, born in 1902; married on October 1, 1918, Howard Clark, son of Samuel and Sarah B. Clark.

b. Robert Lee Underwood (see 504).

c. Alton Parker Underwood, born 1907; married on February 25, 1925, Myrtle Brogan, daughter of S. and Texas Thompson, and had at least two children:

(1). Velma Lela Conner, born on _____.

(2). Emma Frances Fallin, born on _____.

d. Julia Ann Underwood, born on November 14, 1911; married on April 5, 1933, Jerry H. Midkiff, son of Robert and Addie (Trail) Midkiff. Julia Midkiff died on March 25, 1961, and is buried near her father and mother (see next paragraph).

Charles W. Underwood died November 21, 1948, and is buried in the County Line Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery, located (as its name implies) at the boundary of Floyd and Franklin Counties, just east of the Blue Ridge Parkway. His wife, Mary J. Underwood died June 13, 1940, and is buried beside him.

Our records show four distinct Charles W. Underwoods:

(1). The one here listed.

(2). The son of Creed & Rosannah Underwood; born 7/9/1872, and who married Bertie Weaney on April 16, 1899.

(3). One from Botetourt Co.; born in 1861, and shown in the 1900 census with wife, Mary; and sons Harry L., Hampton & Ray.

(4). The son of Noah B. Underwood (508), born ca.

1863. These last two (3 & 4) may be the same person.

504 Robert Lee Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born in Franklin County, Virginia, August 20, 1903 (son of Charles W. Underwood 503); married on December 28, 1922, Annie Lillian Thompson, daughter of Septimas and Florida Texas (Martin) Thompson, and had two children:

a. Shirley Basil Underwood (see 505).

b. Mary Lee Underwood, born circa 1926, in Franklin County, Virginia; married on July 6, 1946, Everett Midkiff, born circa 1920, son of Bob and Addie Trail Midkiff. Nothing more is known of them.

Robert Lee Underwood died on June 26, 1927, and is buried in the County Line Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery near his parents. It was reported to us that he was killed by a falling tree. He was not quite twenty-four years of age at the time of his death. His wife, Annie Lillian (Thompson) Underwood is still living at this date (1987), and resides in Franklin County, Virginia.

505 Basil Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born November 12, 1923, in Franklin County, Virginia (son of Robert Lee Underwood 504);

married on October 14, 1947, Eva Margaret Boyd, daughter of Charlie and Laida (Radford) Boyd, and had five children:

a. Jeanette Underwood, born June 20, 1948; married on _____, _____ Ratliff.

b. Arnold Lee Underwood, born on October 28, 1949; married on October 6, 1972, Betty Ann Cox, daughter of Roy Allen and Irene Huff Cox. Arnold Lee Underwood died on May 22, 1982. We have no record of any children of the marriage.

c. Danny R. Underwood, born on February 10, 1953.

d. Judy Underwood, born on October 13, 1956; married on _____, _____ Clingenpeel.

e. Michael W. Underwood, born April 11, 1963.

Basil Underwood lives (1987) a few miles west of the community of Endicott on County Road 793, along the banks of Runnetbag Creek, in Franklin County, Virginia. When we talked with him a few years back, he was not aware that his ancestors, Samuel and Missiniah Underwood, had settled along Roaring Run Branch of Runnetbag Creek (only a mile or so from where he now lives) back in 1787. We believe that Samuel and Missiniah were the great-great-great-great-great

-grandparents of Basil Underwood.

506 Henry M. Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born in Franklin County, Virginia on February 13, 1826 (son of either Samuel Underwood 008 or William Underwood 015); married circa 1847, Elisabeth _____, and had about nineteen children. It is probable that several of the children listed below are listed twice under different names; in one case, listed by first name, and then listed by second name or nickname. The ages as given in the various census records vary widely; as much as nine years in one case.

a. Noah Underwood (see 507).

b. Creed B. Underwood, born in October, 1853; married in 1878, Sophia Ann Brogan. They are listed in the 1880 census with no children, and in the 1900 census with five daughters.

c. & d. Sophia and Peasey Underwood, twins, born in 1851. Sophia is believed to have married John Henry Underwood, son of Noah B. Underwood (508).

e. James K. T. Underwood, born August 1, 1855; married on March 13, 1879, Eliza Ann Martin, daughter of James and

Agnes Martin, and had at least four children:

(1). Bessie F. Underwood, born in 1878; married on July 28, 1898, Burdine Gillenwater, son of Spuriel and Eliza Gillenwater.

(2). Samuel H. Underwood, born in 1883; married on December 8, 1910, Ulley Janney, daughter of John W. and Ruth Janney.

(3). Amanda Underwood, born in 1885.

(4). Ellis, Underwood, born in 1889; died in 1956. An Ellis Underwood is listed in the 1900 census of Floyd Co., as having been born in August, 1879, with wife, Mary F., and nephew, Martin (3). Ellis Underwood is buried in the Underwood Cemetery, and his tombstone lists his date of birth as 1889, and date of death as 1956.

f. John Underwood, born April 15, 1856. Nothing more is known of him.

g. Kate Underwood, born February 12, 1860; married on September 9, 1877, John Brogan, son of Creed and Terry Brogan.

h. Bluford Underwood, b. circa 1855.

i. Eli Underwood, born ca. 1857. This may be the same as John, above.

j. Charles Underwood, b. circa 1861. This may be the

Charles Underwood listed in the 1880 census of Franklin County, Va., with wife (20), son John (7) and son Robert (5), although the age given for him doesn't seem quite right.

k. William Underwood, b. circa 1869.

l. Virginia Underwood, born circa 1853. She is shown in the 1880 census, but is missing in the 1860 and 1870 census records.

m. Anna Underwood, b. circa 1863.

n. Judy Underwood, born circa 1866.

o. Samuel Henry Underwood, born February 10, 1862; married on November 21, 1882, Elizabeth Ann Martin, daughter of Robert and America Martin (note that James, e. above, married someone by the exact same name, but her parents are shown as being different).

p. Franklin P. Underwood, born on June 20, 1867; married in 1888, Mary Elisabeth Trail. They are shown in the 1900 census with sons Tas (8) and James H. (2). Tas Underwood was born May 19, 1895, and died October 15, 1918. He apparently was killed in World War I. He is buried near his father and mother in the Underwood Cemetery, located about a mile east of

Cannaday Gap near the Blue Ridge Parkway.

q. Ellis Underwood, born ca. 1870; married on July 20, 1899, Mary E. Martin, daughter of Robert and Marcia Martin. Ellis is listed as divorced in the above marriage record.

r. Elisabeth (Bettie) Underwood, born circa 1864; married on November 26, 1888, William Martin Underwood, son of Asa Underwood.

s. Amanda Underwood, born November 17, 1871; married on August 9, 1888, Charles D. Turner.

t. Frances Underwood, born in 1861; married on March 23, 1886, William Tyler Martin, son of Robert and Amanon Martin.

u. Elkanah Underwood, born in 1882; married on February 5, 1901, Lawsey Underwood, daughter of Creed and Sarah Underwood. Elkanah is listed in the marriage records as being the son of Francis T. Underwood (note Frances above). We believe he is a grandson of Henry M. Underwood.

507 Noah Underwood of Floyd County, Virginia, born ca. 1849 in Floyd County, Virginia (son of Henry M. Underwood 506); married in 1873, Mary Martin, and had at least three children:

a. Robert Underwood, b. circa 1876.

b. Henrietta Underwood, born in 1872; married in 1888, John Underwood.

c. Rebecca A. Underwood, born circa 1874; married in 1894, Charles Brogan.

Noah Underwood must have died prior to 1900 since his widow is listed in the 1900 census, with no children, as the mother-in-law of Charlie Brogan.

508 Noah B. Underwood of Floyd County, Virginia, born in May, 1828 (son of Samuel Underwood 008); married circa 1849, Ellender Underwood, daughter of Jesse and Elisabeth Underwood and had five children:

a. John Henry Underwood, born ca. 1850; married on December 27, 1875, Sophia Underwood, daughter of Henry M. Underwood (506), and had one daughter as of 1880:

(1). Eligia Underwood, born 1877.

Sophia Underwood died, and John Henry married on December 5, 1895, Rosabel Pharis, a widow, daughter of John L. and Evaline Peterman.

b. Franklin Prence Underwood, born September 1, 1853; died in May, 1862.

c. Catherine Underwood, born February 2, 1855;

married on June 14, 1877, Bluford Martin, son of Matthew and Millie Martin.

d. Liza E. Underwood, born in 1858; died in April, 1862.

e. Elisabeth E. Underwood, born December 2, 1860; married on August 1, 1883, George Bishop, son of George E. and Mary J. Bishop.

Ellender Underwood died on December 10, 1860, eight days after the birth of her daughter, Elisabeth. Noah B. Underwood then married, on April 10, 1862, Harriet E. Nolen, daughter of Stannen and Mary Underwood¹⁶⁰, and they had thirteen children:

f. Charles W. Underwood¹⁶¹, born circa 1863; married on December 31, 1883, Mary Akers, daughter of Whitley and Fannie Akers.

g. Judith A. Underwood, born circa 1865; married on December 21, 1882, James F. Mills, son of Sylvester and Pernelia Mills.

h. Mary Ann Underwood, born circa 1866; married on August 2, 1883, Tazewell S. Greer, son of James and Elisabeth Greer.

i. Permelia J. Underwood, born December 11, 1867.

j. Octavia Underwood, born in 1871; married on April 6, 1896, Eunice W. Sumner, son of Marion F. and Annie B. Sumner.

k. Lucinda A. Underwood, born circa 1873.

l. Sarah S. Underwood, born circa 1875.

m. Harriet T. Underwood, born circa 1876.

n. Merett A. Underwood (sp. ?), born circa 1878.

o. Isabella¹⁶² C. Underwood, born in 1869; married on January 6, 1885, Albert Lee Epperty, son of James Epperty.

p. Archie M. Underwood, born circa 1879.

q. General R. Underwood, born ca. 1882.

r. Thomas Underwood, born in 1883; married on November 11, 1905, Mary F. Dickerson, daughter of Moses and Elisabeth Dickerson.

Noah B. Underwood lived between the Floyd/Franklin County line, and what is now the Blue Ridge Parkway, at Cannaday Gap. We spoke with an elderly lady (about 1970) who lived in a frame house on the site, and she told us that she remembered many years ago when Noah Underwood's

log house was still standing, just to the rear of her house. Noah Underwood is probably buried in one of the many unmarked graves in the Underwood Cemetery located about a mile southeast of where he lived.

It is strange that we were not able to follow up on more of Noah's many children; especially the sons.

509 Martin Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born in 1837 in Franklin County, Virginia (son of Samuel Underwood 008); married on April 2, 1856, Elisabeth (Betty) Foster, dau. of Gabriel and Mary Foster, and had eight children:

a. Clemintina Underwood, born in February, 1855; married in 1878, Joseph Henry Bowles.

b. Larkin Underwood (see 510).

c. Gabriel Underwood, b. ca. 1860; died May 2, 1861.

d. Martin Underwood, b. on May 13, 1865; married ca. 1885, Mary E. _____, and had two children:

(1). Willie L. Underwood, born in 1886.

(2). Haley Underwood, born in 1887.

e. Elisabeth Underwood, born on June 11, 1867. This may be the Elisabeth Underwood who married Thomas Bouldin in 1885.

f. Samuel Underwood, b. circa 1868;

g. Docia Underwood, born circa 1874.

h. Aaron Underwood, b. circa 1878. It appears from the census records that Elisabeth Underwood died ca. 1878, and Martin A. Underwood then married Mella Smith in 1879. It does not appear that they had any children.

510 Larkin A. Underwood of Floyd County, Virginia, born in Franklin County, Virginia on August 19, 1860 (son of Martin Underwood 509); married on September 3, 1879, Lucinda Catherine McPeak, daughter of Jefferson and Sobrina McPeak, and had six children:

a. Alsaberry Underwood, born circa 1880. He is shown in the 1900 census record as being twenty years of age and living with his parents in Floyd County, Virginia. We have been unable to find his marriage record, and cannot find him in the 1910 census.

b. Wilson M. Underwood, born in 1882; married on February 1, 1905, Vinecia Brim, daughter of Hillany D. and Rachael E. Brim.

c. Aaron Underwood, b. circa 1884.; married in 1911, D. E. Radford.

d. Everett Underwood, born in 1887; married on

December 28, 1910, Dora E. Brim, daughter of Hillary D. and Rachael E. Brim, and had at least one child:

(1). Peerless Heath Underwood, born in 1917; married on January 10, 1946, Susan Zetta Nester, daughter of Sollie and Ellen Nester, and had at least three children:

(a). Butch Edward Underwood, born in 1964; married on June 18, 1983, Marie Frances Reed, daughter of Alfred A. and Frances A. Reed.

(b). Linda Law Underwood, b. in 1947; married on May 10, 1966, Charles William Hicks, son of Charlie W. and Ella L. Hicks.

(c). Larry Peerless Underwood, born in 1949; married on June 18, 1977, Sylvia Marie Mitchel, the divorced daughter of Luther M. and Bertha Bolt.

e. Claude S. Underwood, born in 1892; married on December 23, 1915, Sallie Hylton, daughter of Amp and Mary Hylton, and had at least six children:

(1). Zella Underwood, b. in 1916; married on June 21, 1937, Joe Weddle, son of H. A. and Laura Weddle.

(2). Ruby Underwood, b. in 1917; married on July 10, 1938, Ward Agnew, son of Dan and Effie Agnew.

(3). Ollie Underwood¹⁶³, born in 1917; married on November 4, 1938, James Thomas, son of Andrew and Dora Thomas.

(4). Ava Underwood, born in 1925; married on February 28, 1947, Maynard S. Wells, son of E. F. and Lillian Wells.

(5). Gilbert Calvin Underwood, born in 1927; married on March 6, 1948, Ola Estelle Robertson, daughter of Homer and Lena Robertson.

(6). Manly Vill Underwood, born in 1941; married on July 2, 1950, Rosella Lee Conner, daughter of Alva and Rosella Conner, and had at least one child:

(a). Ronald Lynn Underwood, born in 1955; married on October 19, 1975, Betty Sue Pauley, daughter of William Allen and Mabel L. Pauley.

Claude Underwood is buried in the cemetery on the eastern edge of the town of Floyd, Virginia, along State Route 8.

f. Luther Underwood, b. in 1896; married on July 6, 1916, Ellen Hylton, daughter of Amp and Mary Hylton.

511 Richard G. Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia¹⁶⁴, born in 1822 in Montgomery County (later to become Floyd County), Virginia, (son of Jesse Underwood 014); married in 1849, Adeline Radford, born in March, 1834, daughter of George Radford, and had at least eleven children:

a. Charles C. Underwood, born in 1852; married on January 9, 1872, Rosannah Smith, daughter of Willis and Lucy J. Smith, and had at least two children:

(1). John W. Underwood, born in 1873; married on March 15, 1894, Fannie B. Stanley, daughter of James F. and Susan Stanley.

(2). Robert Underwood, born ca. 1875.

Rosannah S. Underwood was divorced circa 1875, and Charles married Elisabeth _____ sometime prior to 1880, since they are shown in the 1880 census with their two children, John and Robert. Charles C. Underwood died on February 17, 1893 at the age of forty-two.

b. Matilda Underwood, b. in 1851; married on March 20, 1869, George W. Terry, son of S. B. and E. Terry.

c. A son, born March 22, 1855. It is believed that he was stillborn, since no name was given in the birth records and he was not shown in the 1860 census.

d. Margaret Underwood, born in 1857; married on December 23, 1873, William Weste, son of Jacob and Rosannah Weste.

e. Martha Jane Underwood, born in 1859; married on January 27, 1877, Franklin P. Terry, son of Samuel B. and Lucinda Terry.

f. Jesse C. Underwood, born September 1, 1861; married on September 16, 1890, Henrietta Radford, daughter of George W. and Betty Radford, and had at least two children:

(1). Alvin C. Underwood, born in 1892.

(2). Dalace (Dallas) M. Underwood, born in 1893; married on August 24, 1911, Oney Lee Wright, daughter of J. M. and Oney Wright.

g. Tazewell M. Underwood, born in 1864; married on April 11, 1882, Lydia M. Smith, daughter of Willis and Lucy Smith and had one child:

(1). Charles A. Underwood, born in 1883; mar-

ried on December 14, 1904, Mary E. Underwood, daughter of William and Louisa Underwood.

Lydia Smith Underwood died (probably in childbirth), and Tazewell married on October 9, 1884, Josephine Underwood, daughter of David and Rosa Underwood.¹⁶⁵ There may have been children from this marriage, but we have found no record of any.

h. Adeline Underwood, born April 26, 1867, and is shown in the 1870 census as being four years old. Adeline must have died as a child since she is not shown in the 1880 census.

i. Lauza Underwood, b. in 1868; married on January 22, 1886, James B. Stump, son of Molly Stump.

j. Mary Underwood, born circa 1869; married on May 23, 1886, Henry Jackson Smith, son of Peter and Lucinda Smith.

k. Samuel H. Underwood, born in 1873; married on February 8, 1894, Lucy M. Snead, daughter of Cyrus and Mary Snead. In Part I, Samuel H. Underwood is listed as having one son, Cecil L. This is in error. Cecil L. is actually the son of another Samuel H. Underwood of about the same

age (son of Alfred and Judea Underwood) of Patrick County.

l. Wiley Underwood (see 512).

Richard G. Underwood apparently died before 1890, since he is not shown in that census for Floyd County, Virginia. His widow, Adeline, is shown in the 1900 census living in Franklin County, Virginia; and in the 1910 census she is shown living with her son, Wiley, in Floyd County, Virginia. She is listed as being seventy-six years of age at that time.

512 Wiley¹⁶⁶ Underwood of Floyd County, Virginia born in October, 1877 (son of Richard G. Underwood 511); married on November 10, 1904, Eliza¹⁶⁷ J. Kelly, born circa 1883, daughter of J. N. and Sarah J. Kelly, and had at least one child: a Fred Guy Underwood (see 513).

Eliza Kelly Underwood apparently died circa 1916, and Wiley then married, on February 20, 1918, Emma H. Prillaman¹⁶⁸, daughter of Isaac and Betty S. Prillaman. We

know of no children by this second marriage.

In Part I, we had Wiley confused with another Wiley E. Underwood, son of Jesse and Mary J. Underwood. The 1890 census of Floyd County shows still another Wiley E. Underwood, born in 1876, the son of Samuel and Nancy A. Underwood. We wish there were not so many Underwoods with the same name and of about the same age. It becomes very confusing.

513 Fleetwood (Fred) Guy Underwood¹⁶⁹ of Franklin County, Virginia, born circa 1906, in Floyd County, Virginia (son of Wiley Underwood 512); married on December 18, 1925, Ocie Sutliff¹⁷⁰, daughter of Hardin and Naomi Sutliff, and had (?) children:

a. Coy Underwood of Richmond, Virginia.

Coy Underwood stopped by to visit with us briefly a few months back, and he said at the time that he had considerable information on his family,

which we had hoped he would allow us to include in this work. Unfortunately he has not seen fit to supply us with the information as of this time (Feb. 1988).

514 Jesse Underwood of Franklin County, Virginia, born circa 1820 in Franklin County (son of Samuel Underwood 008 ?); married on September 1, 1842, Elisabeth Foster, and had about twelve¹⁷¹ children:

a. Creed Underwood¹⁷², born circa 1844; married on January 24, 1864, Rosy (Rosannah ?) Peters, a widow, daughter of John and Mary Vest. Creed is shown living with his widowed mother in the 1870 census report. We cannot find him in later census reports. A Creed and Rosannah Underwood are shown in the marriage records, with sons Charles W. and E. T. Underwood.

b. Ruth Underwood, born circa 1845; married on May 25, 1865, Moses Jenny, son of Burwell and Mary Jenny.

c. John H. Underwood, born in 1848; married on June 25, 1871, Betty (Elisabeth ?) Hill, daughter of Stephen and

j. Monroe F. Underwood, born circa 1857 and died May 29, 1861.

k. Celia Underwood, born circa 1860. She is shown in the 1870 census as being nine years old.

l. Mary Underwood, born circa 1856; married on February 16, 1877, Peter Martin, son of John and Catherine Martin.
